How I got January's update out I will never know - a lot of IT glitches recently and not having a PC has mean the February update has been challenge to put together, write and edit.

Fairoak Primary School Opens Sept 2025

The newly renamed Gladstone Primary School (and the smaller population of Allensbank Juniors) amalgamate to open in September 2025 under the new name of Fairoak Primary School.

St Monica's will move up to the existing Ysgol Mynydd Bychan site – which in turn will move to the Allensbank Juniors site (on Llanishen Street) whilst, as mentioned before the Allensbank pupils will join with Gladstone pupils. It all seems full circle

When years ago St Monica's came from the bottom of Llanttrissant Street/Merthyr Road to take up residency in part of Gladstone site (the old headteacher he was not happy about that – historical local draaaaaama decades ago!!) yet this was due to both school populations dropping with 'the change' of the 1980's to 2000's with families moving out the area and a dwindling demographic led to less pupils attending our schools.

Now that position is being reversed, as the younger families are moving back into the Cathays district - and the children/pupil numbers going gradually back up.

Mrs. Paula Shipton-Jones will continue as Headteacher at the new amalgamated Gladstone and Allensbank group of children to become the new Fairoak Primary School. I hope our community gets behind the new school set up we wish all 4 primary school's success in the changeover and the coming years settling into their respective buildings.

Early morning haircut?

Given a fair few residents do work long shifts and often cannot shop or use local services in the evenings – a small positive to highlight in our community.

Jack's on the bottom end of Cathays Terrace is open 7:30am onwards (sometimes a bit earlier) in the mornings for those who have long shifts and cannot go for a trim in the evenings. Please do pass this on

Coldest day of the year

Please remember the agricultural industry loves a very cold winter as namely it helps the ground re-set. It may have been a cold winter - yet I hope this leads now to a bumper growing year for the UK agricultural system.

Engaging with the waste producers

One of the Pizza producers have been quite infamous in recent decades for the bi-product, delivery truck nightmares that has caused residents stress etc.

I have been going there for 6 months now, to try and get some ongoing dialogue with the staff to try and understand the dynamics their end of things.

The questions I had was around storage, excess food /pizza produced, waste flow, output etc.

I was trying to understand what prospect could there be of sending the food to the local 'Community Fridge' yet at 4am when the pizza place closes – there are no staff to take the food to the community fridge, more to the point obviously the community fridge is not open that time of the morning.

Bit of idealistic thinking (over-thinking?) yet If we have a community fridge - why not a community oven or hotplate? Not necessarily in the same location (how much would it costs to maintain heat on – expensive! How to run it – independent off-grid system?) yet just sharing some thoughts on how to reduce our waste streams (and stress for treasured residents).

Too proud to ask for help?

Don't be!! It is scary how many residents will not go to a doctors, opticians, dentist – or even the local chemist even if they are suffering a bit of grief with sight, hearing, general pains etc.

A lot of this stems from incurred costs - or feared potential costs - which puts people off going to GP, dentist, opticians etc. Oh dear - back on the issue of money Please all of you get your health checked out We are only human!! Too many think they are invincible

We've lost too many neighbours across Cathays in the last 5 years, I ponder if more of them had regular healthcare checks if they'd still be amongst us. Please people - will you put your health first!!

Tiny income/costs savings for the residents

On theme of costs, I am trying to put posters in from NHS, or the various Uni's of when they are running little projects – which the local residents can get tiny pots of money from.

So for example the Optometry School was running a long term project where they pay £40 for 3-4 hours of testing your eyes as part of a research study.

If I can get info off the 3 colleges, NHS etc – I will aim to get these posters into this community update – if it helps a few of you make an easy £20 or get a shopping voucher.















Waste Oil production and collectors

A lot of small businesses cannot always afford big corporate waste collectors. By chance a discussion with a local Oil Collector from the food/coffee shops it was interesting to see their insight to the changes in the high street with all the 'little' businesses they service.

If the local businesses could tell us which oil collectors they use – it may be a prudent measure to add a few of them to the 'Cathays Trusted Tradesperson' database (based on your professional recommendation).

Keep your receipt at Lidl Cathays

Recently a barrier has been set up in the 'self-serve' part of Lidl on Maindy Road. This obviously has something to do with the level of thefts in any retailer around the UK.

So Please do not throw away your receipt, as you will need it to hover over the 'scan-reader' in order to get out of the self-serve area.

Do not say you were not warned. Keep your receipt until you wish to dispose of it at home.

Local organised walks

The invasive phone calls

Once again – the ghost calls still exists Approximately a decade ago When a neighbour on Treherbert Street told me they were awaiting a phone call from the Velindre Hospital for the necessary cancer treatment of a family member – they were constantly waiting on the amazing NHS to call them on their landline (advanced age – so they never used mobiles) yet all they got was literally 100's of nuisance calls. Very stressful for them!!

To this day – sadly people still not know about the TPS www.tpsonline.org.uk/ Telephone Preference Service – please get your landline and mobiles registered with the TPS to stop the UK based nuisance calls being made to you. It drives people nuts!!!

Death of social media FB etc

The last 18-24 months a lot of residents have complained to me about all the 'anonymous posting' on the infamous Facebook Connect Cathays page — and how the page has become somewhat redundant for Cathays.

It may have a high volume of people on the group, yet most of them (students) left the area years ago. A lot of the businesses that needlessly post on there are from outside the area and not employing local people.

This is not entirely a bad thing, as many have turned away from social media on many levels (including our youngster who anecdotally mock social media as part of self-parody).

This was Paul Byers (A Maindy Road resident) FB group — he set it up in 2011 to benefit the area Paul sadly died in November 2016 (I went to the funeral wake in December) and he would be displeased/spinning in his proverbial grave if he saw the direction it went in over 2019 onwards For the 90% of residents who never were on that FB group — be grateful you missed all the b@~l&%t during lockdown and the very wrong direction it has been going down since As a community we just do not need it whatsoever!!

I invite you to live in the real world, actually talk to your neighbours I do know how amazing 1000's of the residents of Cathays are – I just wish I could have found a way for you to all communicate with each other. So many of you silently lead by example on so many levels You really make us collectively a better community!

SPAM Mail out of control

So for a lot of people, the spam email is still overloading your inboxes (no – not this community update – cheek!) and some residents have told me they can't be bothered to keep 'junking' the email when they get several of them everyday for weeks – to – months on end

All I can do is beg you to endure. From discussions with neighbours (this could be reflective of the whole world) yet when you are targeted they get an onslaught of junk emails — please just keep 'reporting as junk/phishing' — as they will inevitably reduce after a few weeks. Do not let your inbox just pile up with them When you report it — it helps the international digital community flag all these junk mailers and eventually they will get shut down. *Please keep 'junking the junk emails'!!*

It is not because you've been silly with your email address and published it anywhere public – there are many ways your email address is accessed

Cathays Community Centre AGM – 3rd time lucky !!!

The people of Cardiff from many districts are just sick to death with the very poor direction that Cardiff is going in so what can you all do to evoke change?

Still much work to be done

Belongers is the first UK solo show by Manchester-based Mauritian-Chagossian artist Audrey Albert. It explores how Chagossians represent themselves and reclaim their identities while navigating life in countries that have never fully felt like 'home'. The exhibition brings together portraiture, documentary, moving image, cyanotypes, and a traditional Chagossian Kaz (hut), developed through research interviews over the past two years.

Alongside these works, Albert has invited contributions from other artists and researchers, celebrating the multiplicity of Chagossian identities. The exhibition includes perspectives from Mauritius, Wythenshawe and Crawley, each home to large Chagossian communities, and archival glimpses of the Chagos Islands, reflecting the experiences of a diasporic nation denied the right to return since 1968.

Hosted in Wales, which aspires to be the world's first official Nation of Sanctuary, *Belongers* shines a light on the Chagossian community at a critical moment, as the Chagos Islands and their people continue to be influenced and fragmented by domestic and international political and military agendas.
